**AN ACT Permitting Use of Motor Vehicles to Transport Observers to  
Observation Posts without Registration.**

---

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, a state of war exists between the United States and Germany and Japan; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of section 16 of Article XXXI of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**Use of motor vehicles by "aircraft warning service".** On recommendation of the "district director" of the "aircraft warning service", the secretary of state may issue a special sticker to be affixed to the windshield of a motor vehicle which shall entitle the motor vehicle to be used only for the purpose of transporting members of the "aircraft warning service" in that district from their homes to the observation post, and to their homes

from the observation post. No registration fee or excise tax shall be required for motor vehicles used only for the aforesaid purpose.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.
