STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Commissioner of Agriculture.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., c. 125, § 19, amended. Section 19 of chapter 125 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 19. The department of agriculture. The commissioner of agriculture shall receive an annual salary of \$3,500 \$4,500; provided however, that the governor and council may increase said salary to an amount not in excess of \$4,500 \$5,500. He shall also receive his actual expenses incurred in the performance of his official duties. He may expend for such clerical labor as may be required, an amount to be approved by the governor and council and he may expend such sums for postage, telephone, telegraph, and other general office expenses as may be necessary, in the performance of his duties, the same to be paid out of any money appropriated by the legislature for such purpose.'
