STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Relating to Dredging Quahaugs in Maquoit Bay.

Dredging quahaugs in Maquoit bay; regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation making it unlawful to dredge, or to take quahaugs by any means, except by the usual manner of hand digging with a so called clam hoe, or by picking quahaugs out of the mud by hand, from the waters or flats of Maquoit bay, namely: all of the territory north and northeast of a line drawn from the most southerly end of Mere point in the town of Brunswick to the northeasterly end of Little Flying Point in the town of Freeport.

Whoever violates any provisions of this rule and regulation shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$200, or by imprisonment for 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
