Senate Amendment "A" to H. P. 1240, L. D. 739, Bill, "An Act Relating to the Hunting and Trapping of Foxes."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of section I thereof after the headnote thereof, and substituting the following in place thereof:

'For a period of 2 years from the effective date of this act, it shall be lawful to dig out foxes at any time, and to hunt foxes at any time, except Sunday and to trap foxes on one's own land within a distance of not more than 100 yards from a range or shelter where poultry is raised or kept in organized territory in this state, subject to the provisions of sections 42 and 50 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised.'
