**AN ACT Relating to the Reciprocal Enforcement of Violations of Fishing  
Laws in Boundary Waters Between Maine and New Hampshire.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 38, additional.** Chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered section 13, to read as follows:

‘Sec. 13. **Reciprocal enforcement of violations in boundary waters.** Whenever a violation of the sea and shore fisheries laws or the inland fish and game laws of the state of New Hampshire or the state of Maine is committed or attempted to be committed by any person or persons fishing in any waters or portion thereof lying between the state of New Hampshire and the state of Maine any warden or other person, who is authorized to make arrests for violations of the sea and shore fisheries laws and the inland fish and game laws of the state of New Hampshire or the state of Maine, shall have power and authority to make arrests on any part of such waters between the state of New Hampshire and the state of Maine or the shores thereof and to take the person or persons so arrested for trial to the state in which the violation was committed and there to prosecute such person or persons according to the laws of such state.’
