STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Records of Deorganized Towns.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1941, c. 161, amended. Chapter 161 of the public laws of 1941 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Records of deorganized municipalities to be surrendered. Whenever any city, town or plantation within this state shall become deorganized, the city, town or plantation records shall be turned over to the state library. It shall be the duty of the municipal officers in office at the time of deorganization proceedings to deposit with the state librarian the records of their municipality surrendered: all records of birth, marriage and death to the division of vital statistics at Augusta, and all other municipal records to the county commissioners in the county in which the municipality was located.'
