STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Permitting Bowling on Sunday.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., c. 135, § 39, amended. Section 39 of chapter 135 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof the following:
- '; or to the operation of bowling alleys, or to bowling therein from 2 P. M. to II P. M., the provision of this clause to remain in effect only until 90 days after the end of the first regular session of the legislature which shall convene after the termination of the present war.'
