STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Miss Mary A. Hughes, of Frenchville.

Mary A. Hughes; state pension. Resolved: That a pension be, and hereby is, granted to Miss Mary A. Hughes, of Frenchville, to be paid quarterly from the appropriation for teachers' pensions. Said pension shall begin 90 days after the adjournment of the legislature, and shall continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Miss Mary A. Hughes of Frenchville, Maine, is approximately 63 years of age and was graduated from Aroostook State Normal School located in Presque Isle, Maine. She has taught a total of 42 years—21 years in Maine and 21 years in the Province of Quebec.

Section 219, chapter 19, R. S., 1930, provides that a teacher to meet requirements for a \$275 annual pension shall have taught not less than 20 years in Maine and the last 15 years preceding retirement in this state. Miss Hughes has been able to teach but 10 of the 15 years preceding retirement in the state of Maine as provided for in the above section.

Inasmuch as she has taught the full number of years required in the state of Maine she partitions that the provisions above made may be waived in her favor and that the 10 years which she has served satisfy requirements for a \$275 annual pension.
