## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to the Salaries of Commissioner of Labor and Industry and the Commissioner of Insurance as Members of the Industrial Accident Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 55, § 28, amended. The 3rd paragraph of section 28 of chapter 55 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The chairman shall receive a salary of \$4,500 per annum, and the other commissioners a salary of \$4,000 each per annum. The commissioner of labor and industry, in addition to his salary as such, shall receive for his services as a member of the commission two thousand dollars \$1,000 per annum. The eommissioner of insurance, for his services as a member of the commission, shall receive the additional sum of fifteen hundred dollars per annum. The members of the commission shall also receive their actual, necessary, cash expenses while away from their office on official business of the commission.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 125, § 33, amended. The 2nd and 3rd sentences of section 33 of chapter 125 of the revised statutes are hereby amended to read as follows:

'The commissioner of labor and industry, in addition to his salary as

such, shall receive for his services as a member of the commission two thousand dollars \$1,000 annually. The commissioner of insurance, for his services as a member of the commission, shall receive the additional sum of fifteen hundred dollars annually. The members of the commission shall also receive their actual, necessary, cash expenses while away from their office on official business of the commission.'

- Sec. 3. R. S., c. 125, § 20, amended. Section 20 of chapter 125 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
- **'Sec. 20.** The department of labor and industry. The commissioner of labor and industry and state factory inspector shall receive an annual salary of two thousand dollars \$3,000; the commissioner and the deputy state factory inspector shall also receive their actual traveling expenses.'
- Sec. 4. R. S., c. 125, § 16, amended. Section 16 of chapter 125 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 16. The insurance department. The insurance commissioner shall receive an annual salary of two thousand five hundred dollars \$4,500.'
