AN ACT Relating to School Unions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Section 68 of chapter 37 of the revision is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following sentence:

“This section shall not apply to cities, nor to towns authorized by special laws to employ or choose superintendents of schools.”

Sec. 2. Section 72 of chapter 37 of the revision is hereby amended by repealing the first sentence thereof and inserting in lieu thereof the following: “The superintending school committee of a city or town having under its care and custody an aggregate of more than 75 teachers, or when so authorized by special law, may employ a superintendent of schools without uniting with other cities and towns for that purpose, and the state allotment shall not be withheld for the purpose of compelling the formation of a school union.”
