STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Fishing and Hunting Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 33, § 19, sub-§ (2), amended. The 6th and 7th sentences of subsection (2) of section 19 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes are hereby amended to read as follows:

'A license shall be issued to a resident by the clerk of the town in which he resides, or if he is domiciled in an unorganized place, then by the clerk of the nearest town, upon payment of a fee of $\frac{1}{5}$, $\frac{1}{5}$, $\frac{1}{5}$, of which 15c shall be retained by the town clerk. A combination hunting and fishing license may be issued on payment of $\frac{2}{5}$, $\frac{1}{5}$, $\frac{1}{5}$, $\frac{1}{5}$ to be retained by the town clerk.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 33, § 41, sub-§ 2, amended. The 6th and 7th sentences of subsection 2 of section 41 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes are hereby amended to read as follows:

'The license shall be issued to a resident by the clerk of the town in which the applicant resides, or if domiciled in an unorganized place, then by the clerk of the nearest town, upon payment of a fee of \$2.15 \$2, of which 15c shall be retained by the town clerk. A combination hunting and fishing license may be issued on payment of \$2.15 \$3.50, 15c to be retained by the town clerk.'
