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**AN ACT Relating to Free Hunting and Fishing Permits for Veterans.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 33, § 19-B, additional.** Chapter 33 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 19-B, to read as follows:

‘Sec. 19-B. Veterans to have free hunting and fishing permits. A permit to hunt and fish shall be issued free of charge to a resident, who has been honorably discharged from the armed forces of the United States of America, by the clerk of the town in which he resides, or if he is domiciled in an unorganized place, then by the clerk of the nearest town. Such permit shall be valid for a period of 2 years only from the date of discharge. Holders of such permits shall be subject to all the laws of the state and the rules and regulations of the commissioner regulating hunting and fishing; and for violations of said laws and regulations such permit shall be revoked in the same manner as provided in this chapter for the revocation of hunting and fishing licenses.’
