STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Relating to Retirement Pension for Arthur Irish, of Rangeley.

Retirement pension for Arthur Irish. Resolved: That Arthur Irish, of Rangeley, a superintendent of public schools and a regular member of the employees' retirement system of the state, shall be eligible for retirement at half pay by, on, or after July 1, 1945.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The employees' retirement system law now states that a member of the employees' retirement system who has had 25 years of service could retire before July 1, 1945. Mr. Irish, on July 1, 1945, will lack about 7 months of having 25 years of service in Maine. He has also served 7 years outside the state for which he has never received any credit by the employees' retirement board.
