**RESOLVE, in Favor of T. E. McSherry, of Fryeburg.**

**T. E. McSherry; compensated. Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$622.50 from the appropriation for the department of inland fisheries and game to be paid to T. E. McSherry, of Fryeburg, as a full and final settlement for his claim against the state for damage to his apple orchard by deer.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

This damage was done during 1943 and 1944.

The orchard consists of approximately 1200 trees between 7 and 10 years old, and a new planting, set out in 1944, which was ruined.
