**AN ACT** Relating to Use of Gill Net in Taking White Fish.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

**R. S., c. 33, § 28, amended.** The last sentence of section 28 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows :

'Except that gill nets of not larger than  $1\frac{1}{4}$  inch mesh may be used in the taking of white fish in Eastern Grand lake and Hot Brook lake in Aroostook and Washington counties and in Baskahegan lake, Pocumpus lake and Western Grand lake, all in Washington county, and in Mattawamkeag lake in Aroostook county, and in **First Debsconeag lake and Throughfare leading to the West Branch of the Penobscot river, in the county of Piscataquis** during the month of November of each year.'
