#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Payment of Funeral Expenses of Persons Receiving Old Age Assistance and Aid to the Blind.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 22, § 269, amended. Section 269 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 269. Funeral expenses of person assisted. On the death of a recipient reasonable funeral expenses not exceeding \$100 shall be paid by the state if the estate of the deceased is insufficient to pay the same of old age assistance, the state may pay burial expenses not exceeding \$100 if the total expense of burial, not including cost of transportation to a place of burial outside the limits of the town where such recipient died, does not exceed \$150; but no payments shall be made by the state if the estate of the deceased is sufficient to pay such funeral expenses.'
- Sec. 2. R. S., c. 22, § 291, amended. Section 291 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 291. Funeral expenses of person aided. On the death of a recipient reasonable funeral expenses not exceeding \$100 shall be paid by the state if the estate of the deceased is insufficient to pay the same of aid to the blind, the state may pay burial expenses not exceeding \$100

if the total expense of burial, not including cost of transportation to a place of burial outside the limits of the town where such recipient died, does not exceed \$150; but no payments shall be made by the state if the estate of the deceased is sufficient to pay such funeral expenses.'
