STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Port of Calais Authority.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1935, c. 39, § 1, repealed and replaced. Section 1 of chapter 39 of the private and special laws of 1935 is hereby repealed and replaced, to read as follows:

'Sec. 1. "The Port of Calais Authority", created. There is hereby created "The Port of Calais Authority" which shall have the powers and duties as set forth in this act. There shall be a board of directors of 5 members who shall exercise the powers and duties of said authority chosen as follows: 3 members by the city council of Calais, 1 member who shall be a resident of Washington county by the Washington county commissioners, and 1 member who shall be a resident of Aroostook county by the Aroostook county commissioners. All members of the board of directors shall hold office for a term of 3 years or until their successors are duly appointed and qualified, except that members of the board now in office shall hold office for the balance of the term for which they were chosen and as the term of each member expires a successor shall be appointed as hereinbefore provided. The members shall serve for their term or until their successors are duly appointed and qualified. In case of the death or resignation of any member, the body hereinbefore authorized

to appoint such member shall appoint another member for the remainder of the unexpired term. The members of the board shall receive such compensation as the city council may determine but each member shall receive the same compensation.'
