**AN ACT Relating to the Owning and Keeping of Bulls Over Eighteen
Months of Age.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., c. 127, § 2-A, additional. Chapter 127 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 2-A, to read as follows :

'Sec. 2-A. Bulls not permitted to run at large; penalty. No owner or keeper of any bull over 18 months of age shall permit said bull to run at large, or loose in any pasture.

Whoever violates the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100, or by imprisonment for not more than 60 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.'
