IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Salaries of Court Stenographers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., c. 100, § 185, amended. The 1st sentence of section 185 of chapter 100 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows :

'The chief justice of the supreme judicial court may appoint not more than 11 stenographers to serve for a term of 7 years, who shall report the proceedings in the supreme judicial court and in the superior court and who shall be officials of the court to which they may from time to time be assigned by the chief justice, and be sworn to the faithful discharge of their duties, and each of whom shall receive from the state a salary of ~~\$3,000~~ \$4,000 per year.'
