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**RESOLVE, in Favor of a Special Recess Committee to Study the School Pension and Retirement Laws of the State and Report to the Next Regular Session.**

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**Special recess committee to study school pension and retirement laws.**  
**Resolved:** That a special legislative recess committee be appointed to study the teachers' pension and retirement laws of the state and report to the next regular session on the possibility and advisability of merging state teachers' pensions and the teachers' retirement system under one classification to be administered under one board and to provide funds therefor. This committee to be made up as follows: one member from the senate appointed by its president, one from the house appointed by the speaker, one member representing the teachers' retirement board appointed by the commissioner of education, one from the state employees' retirement board appointed by the chairman of that board, one member from the Maine teachers' association appointed by its secretary, and 2 members appointed by the governor, and be it further

**Resolved:** That the sum of \$5,000, from general fund of the state, be made available for this study to employ competent actuarial services, to defray necessary traveling and other expenses incurred in the study of, and preparation for such legislation; and be it further

**Resolved:** That all members of the above-mentioned committee, not employees of the state, shall be entitled to \$5 per diem and actual expenses for their services.
