**AN ACT to Incorporate a Part of the Town of Frenchville in Aroostook  
County into the Town of Madawaska.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**Part of Frenchville incorporated into Madawaska.** All that part of the town of Frenchville in Aroostook county, lying within the following described lines and boundaries, namely: Beginning at a cedar post on the bank of the St. John River marked on the east side Lot No. 106 and on the south side Lot No. 105; thence S. 24° 30' E. along southwest line of Lot No. 106, 8728.5 feet to a cedar post marked on the north side Lot No. 106 and on the west side Lot No. 105 (River Lots); thence N. 21° 15' E. 117.2 feet along east line of Lot No. 106 to a cedar post marked 1937; thence S. 11° E. 1604.2 feet across Lot No. 105 (second tier) to a cedar post marked 1937 located on the south line of Lot No. 105; thence N. 79° 30' E. 2011.8 feet along south line of Lot No. 105 and north side on the Grant Lot No. 97 to a cedar post marked on the south side Lot No. 97 and on the north side Lot No. 133 and on the west side Lot No. 106; thence S. 22° 30' W. 1650 feet along east line Grant Lot No. 97 to a cedar post marked on the north side Lot No. 133 and on the south side Lot No. 147 and on the west side Lot No. 97; thence N. 80° 30' E. 5318.8 feet along southerly lines of Lots No. 133, 134, 135, 136, 137, 138 and 139 to a cedar post marked Madawaska on the north side and Frenchville on the south

side and 1944 on the east side. The last described cedar post is situated on the town line between Frenchville and Madawaska, thence in a northerly direction following the said town line between Frenchville and Madawaska to St. John River, so-called, thence in a southwesterly direction following said St. John River to the point of beginning, together with the inhabitants thereof, is hereby set off from said Frenchville and annexed to said Madawaska and said inhabitants shall enjoy the same rights and be subject to the same restrictions as the inhabitants of the town of Madawaska.
