### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE

#### AN ACT Relating to Credibility of Witnesses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 100, § 128, amended. Section 128 of chapter 100 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 128. Conviction affects credibility only; limitation. No person is incompetent to testify in any court or legal proceeding in consequence of having been convicted of an offense; but and no such conviction may be shown to affect his credibility except a conviction of a felony within 6 years prior to the commencement of an action before any court or a legal proceeding at which the person so convicted is testifying.'
