**AN ACT to Provide for the Payment of Expenses Incurred by the Maine
State Office Building Authority and the Building Commission.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Expenses may be paid from general fund, when. Until the Maine State Office Building Authority shall have been able to borrow money as authorized by the provisions of section 9 of chapter 76 of the private and special laws of 1941, expenses incurred by the Authority and by the Building Commission for purposes contemplated by the act may be paid out of the general fund of the state on warrants drawn by the governor and council, but when funds shall come into the hands of the Authority the state shall be reimbursed therefrom for all payments made under the provisions of the section.

Sec. 2. State may purchase notes of the Authority. When there is money in the treasury which, in the judgment of the treasurer of state, is not needed to meet current obligations, he may, with the advice and consent of the governor and council, invest such amount as he deems advisable in bonds, notes, or evidences of indebtedness issued by the Maine State Office Building Authority pursuant to section 9 of chapter 76 of the private and special laws of 1941.
