STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Providing for an Increase in State Pension for Mildred Kennedy, of Easton.

Mildred Kennedy; pension increased. Resolved: That a pension of \$30 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Mildred Kennedy, of Easton, to be paid monthly from the appropriation for special legislative pensions. Said pension shall begin July 1, 1945, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

That part of chapter 145 of the resolves of 1941 which provides for a state pension for Mildred Kennedy, of Easton, is hereby repealed.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mildred Kennedy, of Easton, is 43 years of age. When she was 14 years of age, she suffered an attack of whooping cough and scarlet fever, and has never walked since that time. Since her first year in high school, she has been unable to even move herself from her chair. She has a brother and sister both married but unable to assist.

The \$10 special resolve pension allowed Miss Kennedy in 1941 is wholly inadequate for her maintenance. She is in urgent need.
