RESOLVE, in Favor of Albert Leslie Shorey, of Surry.

Albert Leslie Shorey; superintendent's pension. Resolved: That Albert Leslie Shorey, of Surry, is hereby made eligible to receive a retirement pension under the provisions of subsection I of section 3 of chapter 60 of the revised statutes.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Albert Leslie Shorey of Surry, Maine is 71 years of age. He has a physical disability and is needy. He has served as a teacher and superintendent of schools for 35 19/36 years and was serving as a superintendent in 1939, two years prior to the passage of the act which classified superintendents of schools, in service as such, prior to July 1, 1924, as eligible to benefit under the provisions of the state employees' pension act. He was retired two years prior to the passage of this law, but in all other respects fully qualifies.

He respectfully petitions the legislature to waive this requirement which calls for a superintendent to have been actively engaged in this service when this law became effective. In all other respects he could be declared eligible.
