RESOLVE, in Favor of William A. Johnson, of Orrington.

William A. Johnson; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$720 from the appropriation for the department of inland fisheries and game to be paid to William A. Johnson, of Orrington, as a full and final settlement for his claim against the state for damage to his poultry by foxes.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Foxes caused the loss of 800 poultry from the age of 6 weeks to 6 months, at an average price of 90c each.
