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**AN ACT Relating to Tuition in Secondary Schools.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 37, § 99, amended.** The last sentence of the first paragraph of section 99 of chapter 37 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘Provided, further, that any town not maintaining a high school may pay tuition for any student who with parents or guardian resides in said town and who attends an approved school of secondary grade in a town adjacent to the state of Maine in another state, when distance and transportation facilities make attendance in a Maine high school or academy inexpedient; or who attends an approved school of secondary grade in another state when said school specializes in the correction of physical defects and when by reason of a physical disability the individual requires a specialized type of training available in said school but not obtainable in any approved secondary school in the state of Maine.’
