STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Providing for an Increase in State Pension for Hallie W. Stone of Portland.

Hallie W. Stone; pension increased. Resolved: That a pension of \$30 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Hallie W. Stone, of Portland, to be paid monthly from the appropriation for special legislative pensions. Such pension shall begin July 1, 1945, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

That part of chapter 77 of the resolves of 1939 which provides for a state pension for Hallie W. Stone, of Portland, is hereby repealed.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mrs. Stone is now receiving a pension of \$12 per month which is insufficient. She is deaf and has very poor circulation, which causes her hands to become completely numb at times. She does some sewing but is unable to do much because of this circulatory condition which affects her hands.
