• **AN ACT Relating to Soil Conservation.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 29, § 10, sub-§ I, amended. The 2nd sentence of subsection I of section 10 of chapter 29 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘All moneys allocated to any district by the said committee shall be available to the supervisors of such district for all administrative and other expenses of the district under the provisions of this chapter ~~and for all administrative and other expenses of the board of adjustment established or to be established by such district.~~’

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 29, § 10, sub-§ II, amended. The 1st sentence of subsection II of section 10 of chapter 29 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘Seventy-five per cent of all moneys which may be appropriated to pay the administrative and other expenses of soil conservation districts shall be allocated **equally** by the committee among all the districts organized, or to be organized, within the ensuing biennial fiscal period, under the provisions of this chapter, ~~in direct proportion to the total acreage of land within each district.~~’
