STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Authorizing Commissioner of Agriculture to Register Trade-Marks.

Emergency preamble. Wherea's, it is vitally necessary to protect state of Maine products in Canada by registering trade-marks; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature this fact creates an emergency within the meaning of section 16 of Article XXXI of the constitution of Maine, and requires the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Registration of trade-marks. Resolved: That the commissioner of agriculture be, and hereby is, authorized to make application, attested to by the secretary of state, to register with the commissioner of patents, Ottawa, Canada, the trade-marks "State of Maine", "Super Spuds" and "Chef's Special" for potatoes in their natural state, that is, table stock potatoes, seed potatoes, canned, frozen, and fresh vegetables, berries and fruits, fresh, frozen, canned lobsters, crabmeat and scallops and seafood.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.
