STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Keeping of Certain Animals Confined.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 127, § 2-B, additional. Chapter 127 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 2-B, to read as follows:

‘Sec. 2-B. Certain animals to be confined; penalty. No owner of any sheep, swine, horse, ass, mule, goat or neat cattle shall permit such animals to run at large.

Whoever violates the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100, or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.’
