STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Free Fishing and Hunting Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 33, § 19, sub-§ (10), amended. Subsection (10) of section 19 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
- '(10) All persons, who at the time of the their enlistment or induction into the military service were residents of the state of Maine and who are now serving in the armed forces of the United States of America, may procure from any city or town clerk in the state, free of charge, except for clerk's fee of 15c, a special resident fishing and hunting license good for the year in which applied for. Holders of such licenses shall be subject to all the laws of the state and the rules and regulations of the commissioner relating to fishing and hunting; and for violation of said laws of the state or the rules and regulations of the commissioner, said licenses shall be revoked as provided in this chapter. The provisions of this subsection, however, shall be in effect only for the duration of the present war.'
- Sec. 2. R. S., c. 33, § 41, sub-§ 2, amended. Subsection 2 of section 41 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding after the 2nd sentence thereof a new sentence to read as follows:

'All persons, who at the time of their enlistment or induction into the military service were residents of the state of Maine and who are now serving in the armed forces of the United States of America, may procure from any city or town clerk in the state, free of charge except for clerk's fee of 15c, a special resident hunting and fishing license good for the year in which applied for. Holders of such licenses shall be subject to all the laws of the state and the rules and regulations of the commissioner relating to hunting and fishing; and for violation of said laws of the state or the rules and regulations of the commissioner, said license shall be revoked as provided in this chapter. Provided, however, that these provisions shall be in effect only for the duration of the present war.'
