STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Free Fishing and Hunting Licenses for Citizens Over 65 Years of Age.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 33, & 19, sub-§ (11), additional. Section 19 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection to be numbered (11) and to read as follows:

'(11) All residents of the state, who have reached the age of 65, may procure from any city or town clerk in the state, free of charge, except for clerk's fee of 15c, a special resident fishing license good for the year in which applied for. Holders of such licenses shall be subject to all the laws of the state and the rules and regulations of the commissioner relating to fishing; and for violation of said laws of the state or the rules and regulations of the commissioner, said licenses shall be revoked as provided in this chapter.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 33, § 41, sub-§ 9, additional. Section 41 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection to be numbered 9 and to read as follows:

'9. All residents of the state, who have reached the age of 65, may procure from any city or town clerk in the state, free of charge, except

for clerk's fee of 15c, a special resident hunting license good for the year in which applied for. Holders of such licenses shall be subject to all the laws of the state and the rules and regulations of the commissioner relating to hunting; and for violation of said laws of the state or the rules and regulations of the commissioner, said licenses shall be revoked as provided in this chapter.'
