STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Disclosure Commissioners.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 107, § 24, amended. The 1st sentence of section 24 of chapter 107 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Such magistrate as described in the preceding section shall thereupon issue under his hand and seal a subpoena to the debtor commanding him, or in case the debtor is a corporation commanding an officer thereof to appear before any such disinterested magistrate within said county in the town in which the debtor, the petitioner or his attorney resides, or the corporation has an established place of business, or in which any officer thereof on whom the subpoena is served, resides, and in case there is no such magistrate disclosure commissioner in such town then in the nearest town thereto in which there is such a magistrate or in the shire town of said county, at a time and place therein named to make full and true disclosure, on oath, of all the business and property affairs of such debtor.'
