**RESOLVE, Providing for a Fish Screen at Foot of Echo Lake in the
Town of Fayette.**

Foot of Echo lake; screening of. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to screen the foot of Echo lake, in the town of Fayette, county of Kennebec; provided, however, that said screen shall not be erected at the foot of Echo lake until some responsible corporation, or incorporated fish and game club, or the town in which the foot of the lake to be screened is situated, or some other town in the county in which said waters are situated, shall have, in legal town meeting, and having an article in the warrant for said town meeting for that purpose, by vote of record, vote to assume all liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of water through the same.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The screen at the foot of Echo lake is in very bad condition and due to this fact many fish escape every year. There are several summer camps on Echo lake and it is highly necessary that the fish in this be prevented from escape to other waters.
