STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Payments to County Law Libraries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 151, repealed and replaced. Section 151 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

‘Sec. 151. Payments to county law libraries. The treasurer of each county shall pay annually to the treasurer of the law library association of his county, for the uses and benefits of the county law library, as follows:

Androscoggin, \$1,500,

Aroostook, \$1,900, of which \$1,100 shall be for the use and benefit of the county law library in the court house at Houlton in said county and \$800 shall be for the use and benefit of the county law library in the court house at Caribou in said county,

Cumberland, \$1,000,

Franklin, \$750,

Hancock, \$1,000,

Kennebec, \$1,000,

Knox, \$1,000,

Lincoln, \$250,
Oxford, \$500,
Penobscot, \$1,000,
Piscataquis, \$500,
Sagadahoc, \$500,
Somerset, \$1,500,
Waldo, \$500,
Washington, \$900,
York, \$1,250.

The treasurer of each county shall also pay to the treasurer of the law library association of his county all money received from persons admitted upon motion to practice in courts of record as attorneys without a certificate from the board of examiners of applicants for admission to the bar.'
