## STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE

#### AN ACT Amending the Charter of the Calais School District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1937, c. 27, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 27 of the private and special laws of 1937 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 1. Calais School District, incorporated. Subject to the provisions of section 7 hereof, the inhabitants and territory within the city of Calais are hereby created a body politic and corporate under the name of Calais School District for the purpose of erecting, equipping and maintaining on city property  $\mathbf{e}$  school buildings buildings; for the purpose of maintaining and improving other school buildings in said district; for the purpose of financing increased school expenses caused by the loss of  $\mathbf{e}$  major school buildings by fire in April, 1935 and January, 1945; for the purpose of replacing city and school trust funds lost through bank failure; and for the purpose of maintaining a school with the right to lease or let said property to said city; all for the benefit of the inhabitants of said city.'

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1937, c. 27, § 4, amended. The 1st sentence of section 4 of chapter 27 of the private and special laws of 1937 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'To procure funds for the purposes of this act and such other expense as

may be necessary to the carrying out of said purposes, the said district is hereby authorized to issue its bonds and notes, but shall not incur a total indebtedness exceeding the sum of 50,000 \$175,000.'
