#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Amend the Workmen's Compensation Act as to Minors Illegally Employed, Attorneys' Fees and Waiting Period.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 26, § 7, amended. Section 7 of chapter 26 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph to read as follows:

'In case of injury to a minor who at the time is employed illegally, the compensation shall be twice what it would be if the employment had been legal; but the employer alone shall be liable for said increased amount of compensation.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 26, § 9, amended. Section 9 of said chapter 26 is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph to read as follows:

'Fees of attorneys for services in support of any claim under this act, except as provided in section 41 hereof, shall be subject to the approval of the commission.'

Sec. 3. R. S., c. 26, § 10, amended. Section 10 of said chapter 26 is hereby repealed, and in place thereof is substituted the following:

'Sec. 10. Waiting period; when compensation therefor payable. Compensation shall begin on the 8th day of incapacity unless incapacity continues for a period of 2 weeks or more, in which case compensation shall begin on the 1st day of incapacity.'
