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**AN ACT Relating to the Hunting and Trapping of Foxes.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 33, § 72, sub-§ (1), additional.** Section 72 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection to be lettered (1), to read as follows:

‘(1) For a period of 2 years from July 9, 1945, it shall be lawful to dig out foxes at any time and to hunt foxes at any time, except Sunday and in the night-time, in organized territory in this state. It shall be lawful to trap foxes or to cause to have foxes trapped, at any time, on one’s own land, within a distance of 100 yards from a shelter or range where poultry is raised or kept.’
