STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Adoption of Persons 21 Years of Age or Over.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 145, § 35, amended. Section 35 of chapter 145 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 35. Who may adopt a person. Any unmarried inhabitant of the state, or any husband and wife jointly, may petition the judge of probate for their county for leave to adopt a minor child person, regardless of age, and for a change of his or her name. Any husband and wife jointly may present such petition for the adoption of a child of cither, regardless of age. Any unmarried inhabitant of another state, or any non-resident husband and wife jointly, may present such petition in the probate court of the county where such child person lives. The consent of the natural parents shall not be required for the adoption of a person who has reached the age of 21 years or over.'
