### MEMORIAL TO THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES

#### STATE OF MAINE

In the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Five

#### MEMORIAL

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress Assembled

We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Maine in the Ninety-Second Legislative Session assembled, most respectfully present and petition your Honorable Body as follows:

Whereas, there is now pending before the Congress of the United States proposed legislation providing for universal military training of the young men of our country after arrival at the age of eighteen years; and

Whereas, it is desirable in the interests of the common defense and welfare to provide for a continuing program whereby at all times the United States will have available youth trained in the art of defense; and

Whereas, it is desirable for the youth of our country to obtain such military and physical training; now, therefore, be it

**Resolved:** That we, your Memorialists, do hereby respectfully petition and urge the Members of Congress to take such steps as are necessary to best safeguard the welfare of the United States; and be it further

**Resolved:** That a copy of this Memorial, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be immediately transmitted by the Secretary of State, by registered mail, to the proper officers and committees of the United States Senate and House of Representatives, the President of the United States and to each of the Representatives and Senators representing the State of Maine in the United States Congress.
