AN ACT to Amend the Charter of the Brunswick Village Corporation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1887, c. 172, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 172 of the private and special laws of 1887 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 1. Corporate limits; corporate name. The territory in the town of Brunswick, within a radius of ~~one mile~~ $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles from the town house, with the inhabitants thereon, is hereby created a body politic and corporate by the name of the Brunswick Village Corporation, with all the rights and privileges granted by the laws of the state, to corporations.'

Sec. 2. Effective date; referendum. This act shall take effect only for the purpose of permitting its submission to the legal voters of the Brunswick Village Corporation, at its annual or special meeting to be held before May, 1946, and to the legal voters of the territory included in such $1\frac{1}{4}$ mile radius. The corporation clerk shall prepare the required ballots, upon which he shall reduce the subject matter of this act to the following question: "Shall 'An Act to Amend the Charter of the Brunswick Village Corporation' be accepted?" and the voters shall indicate by a cross placed

over the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same. This act shall take effect for all the purposes of this act immediately upon the acceptance of this act by a majority of the votes cast at said meeting. The result of the vote shall be declared by the corporation clerk and a certificate thereof filed by the said clerk with the secretary of state.
