**RESOLVE, to Create a Special Joint Committee to Study Wild and Fur-Bearing Animals.**

---

**Committee appointed. Resolved:** That a special committee be appointed consisting of 2 members from the senate and 3 members from the house of representatives to be nominated respectively by the president of the senate and the speaker of the house; and be it further

**Resolved:** That this committee study the problem of importation and productivity of wild and fur-bearing animals in the state in order to ascertain the possible financial benefit to the state from such importation and productivity; and be it further

**Resolved:** That said special committee make a complete report of its findings to the 93rd legislature with any recommendations for legislative action; and be it further

**Resolved:** That the sum of \$400 be appropriated from the general fund to carry out the provisions of this resolve.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS

The state of Maine can benefit financially from the increase of wild and fur-bearing animals within the state and the importation of such animals into the state, and it is desirable to set up a committee to study the possibilities and make recommendations.
