RESOLVE, in Favor of Cora Porter of Mapleton.

Retirement pension for Cora Porter. Resolved: That Cora Porter, of
Mapleton, a teacher in the public schools of the state, shall be eligible for
retirement by, on, or after July 1, 1945.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mrs. Porter will be 70 years old on September 27, 1945. She has 37 years of experience in education, including teaching and a short time as local superintendent of schools. She spent a year or two of this time in the Massachusetts schools. The Maine non-contributory law for teachers' pensions requires that the last 15 years before retirement be spent in the Maine schools, and the retirement association requires only the last 7. At the close of the present school year, Mrs. Porter will have taught 7 years in Maine since returning from Massachusetts. It is requested that the 15 year requirement be waived in her case. In all other respects she is eligible for the maximum pension under the non-contributory law.
