STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, for Repairing Fish Screen at Outlet of Messalonskee Lake.

Fish screen at Messalonskee lake; repairing of. Resolved: That the sum of \$500 be, and hereby is, appropriated from the legislative appropriation for the department of inland fisheries and game to aid in repairing the fish screen at the outlet of Messalonskee lake in the town of Oakland in the county of Kennebec; provided, however, that no appropriation shall become available for this purpose until the town of Oakland shall assume the liability of keeping said screen free from sticks, leaves and all debris; and provided further, that said appropriation shall not be available until the citizens of the towns of Oakland, Sidney and Belgrade or some responsible person or persons shall have paid in to the state treasury $\frac{1}{2}$ the amount necessary to repair said screen; and provided further, that the state shall be liable for only $\frac{1}{2}$ of the cost of said repairs.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This screen was built in 1929 and due to ice conditions and general wear over a period of years it is now badly in need of repairs. The screen is at the outlet of the whole Belgrade Chain of Lakes and as these lakes are stocked it is necessary that this screen be in good repair.
