STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Velma Norton, of Caribou.

Velma Norton; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$60 to be paid to Velma Norton of Caribou, as a full and final settlement for her claim against the state for damage to 6 angora rabbits killed by a dog; said sum to be paid from the general fund of the state.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Six angora rabbits belonging to Velma Norton, of Caribou, were killed during the night of August 6, 1944. A large dog pulled down the doors of the building which housed the rabbits, dragged them out and shook them to death. They were fur and wool producers and worth \$10 each. These rabbits were legally in captivity.
