**RESOLVE, Granting a State Pension to Eva M. Farrington Cary, of
Bowdoinham.**

Eva M. Farrington Cary; state pension. Resolved: That an annual pension of \$375 be granted to Eva M. Farrington Cary, of Bowdoinham, to be paid quarterly from the state school fund. Said pension shall begin July 1, 1945, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Eva M. Farrington Cary, of Bowdoinham, is approximately 66 years of age. She was graduated from Farmington Normal School, class of 1903, and holds a life teacher's certificate.

She has taught a total of $30\frac{1}{2}$ years. Twenty-six and one-half years of this service has been in this state. She has, however, taught only $13\frac{1}{2}$ of the 15 which are required by law to have been served in this state preceding retirement.

Inasmuch as she has more years in Maine than are required under the provisions of the noncontributory teachers' pension act, and merely lacks a year and a half of fulfilling the latter provision, which calls for 15 years of this service to have been in this state immediately preceding retirement, she petitions that this minor deficiency of $1\frac{1}{2}$ years be waived in her favor and that she be allowed a \$375 annual pension.
