**RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing for Atlantic Salmon in Narraguagus
River and Its Tributaries.**

Narraguagus river and its tributaries; fishing for Atlantic Salmon regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation that no fish may be taken from the Narraguagus river and its tributaries in the towns of Cherryfield, Deblois and Beddington, in the county of Washington, except by using a single hook on a line.

No person shall take or have in his possession more than 2 Atlantic salmon taken from these waters in any one day.

From Stillwater Dam in Cherryfield to the mouth of the river, fishing for Atlantic salmon is permitted until September 30.
