STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Recorder of the Bath Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- P. & S. L., 1941, c. 32, amended. That part designated 'Sec. 2.' of chapter 32 of the private and special laws of 1941 as amended by chapter 83 of the private and special laws of 1943 is hereby further amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 2. Qualifications of judge and recorder; salary. Said judge and recorder shall be members of the bar of Sagadahoc county, and shall reside during their continuance in office in said county. The judge of said court shall receive from the county of Sagadahoc an annual salary of \$1,650 to be paid to him in quarterly payments. Said recorder shall receive from the county of Sagadahoc an annual salary of \$600 \$1,100 to be paid to him in quarterly payments. The salary of the recorder shall remain in force for 2 years, after which period the present statute shall return to full force and effect. Both salaries shall be in full for all fees and emoluments of their respective offices.'
