AN ACT Enlarging the Powers of the West Paris Village Corporation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1921, c. 7, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 7 of the private and special laws of 1921 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 2. May raise money for fire department, street lights, water, sewerage, police, support of library and for salaries and other expenses. Said corporation is hereby invested with power at any legal meeting called for the purpose, to raise such sums of money as may be sufficient for the purchase, repair and preservation of one or more fire engines, engine houses, hose, buckets, ladders, or other apparatus for the extinguishment of fire, for the extension of the present hydrant system, and for organizing and maintaining within the limits of said territory an efficient fire department; also lighting its streets, maintaining a police force, and for the support of a library within the limits of said corporation; and for officers' salaries and expenses and such other current expenses as this act calls for; **and for furnishing water and sewerage.'**
